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Adopting standardized cancer patient pathways as a policy at different organizational levels in the Swedish Health System

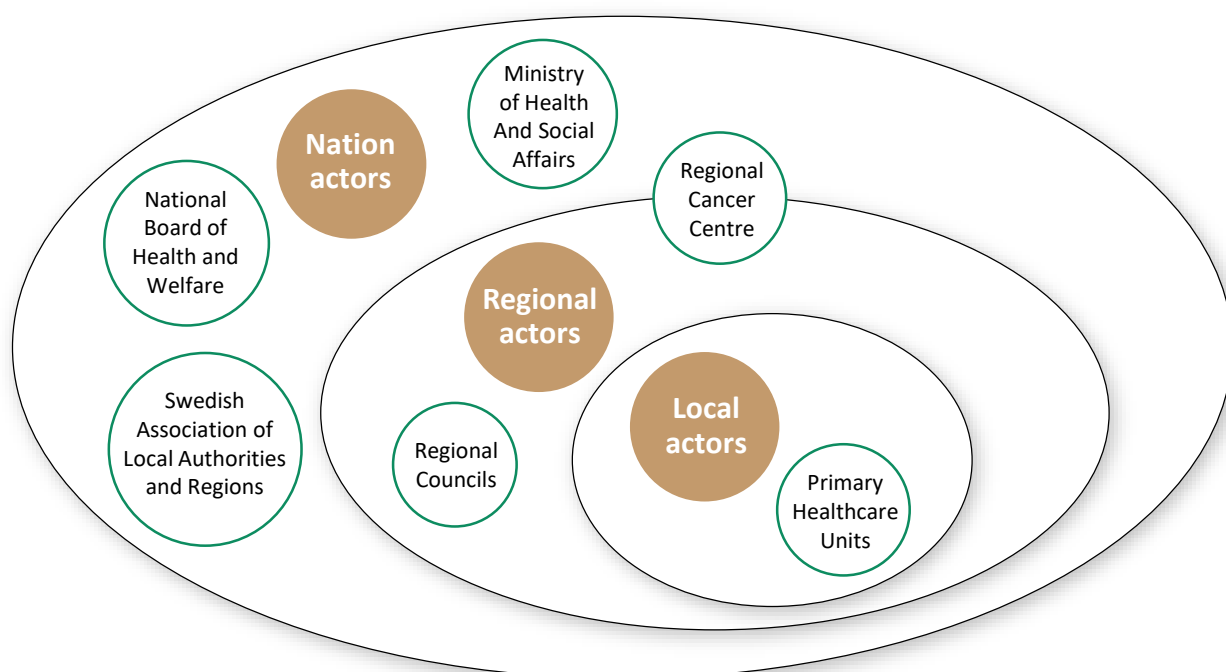
